

Opening Devotion/Sharing

Pastor Heather votes to approve. Diane seconds. Motion Passes

Reports

Pr. Heather

1) We have secured the funding for our sanctuary stage of our technology upgrade (\$63,679.52). About \$50,000 was raised by the congregation (including a \$25,000 individual donation) and an additional \$13,000 was secured from our donor advised fund to allow us to move forward. I invite a motion to approve the expenditure of 50% for our down payment to Audio Architects (\$31,839.76). Our timeline will bring us well into the new year for the completion of the project, but as hardware becomes available, installation will happen in pieces. Upgrades include the addition of a second camera, new projectors, a new mixer, and all the integration necessary to make our system more volunteer friendly (as well as consistently working!). We will need to replace the computer in the sanctuary that runs the PowerPoint slides (it is quite old and does not have the necessary inputs).

Rod motions to approve the purchase of the new computer. Lindsay seconds with the amendment that if the computer takes too long, we would instead purchase some sort of stop-gap solution first. Motion passes.
Rod motions to approve the giving the 50% down payment to Audio Architects for the sanctuary technology upgrade. Katie seconds. Motion passes.

2) I share gratitude to all our wonderful volunteers who helped out with VBS (a shared program with Christ, Peace, Little Elk Creek/New Hope and the United Methodist church). In a last-minute change (only days before) we learned that Luther Park would not be able to provide counselors to assist in leading our VBS program (curriculum, all music leadership, and teaching roles for our older children). Many people stepped up to help, including Ted Benson and Dale Freberg who helped lead music. Jane Kingzett, Mary Benson, Connie Weber and Cheryl Gilbertson-Merrill helped in all sorts of ways. Our middle school and high school youth took many leadership roles (leading music, teaching and helping). Denise Vick took on even more leadership roles and Pastor Sarah spent the whole week filling holes. We had about 65 children, many from OSL. There was great energy and joy thanks to many hands helping and serving.

3) We have settled on our fall worship and education schedule. Worship will take place at 9AM and Education (Sunday School and various adult opportunities throughout the year) will begin at 10:15AM concluding at 11AM. Fellowship will begin immediately after worship, allowing some transition time between worship and education as well as a few minutes to grab a cup of coffee/snack. We have some fun fall events scheduled including a food packing event on Sunday, September 11 in celebration of our ELCA Day of Service (God's Work. Our Hands. Sunday). On Sunday, September 18, we plan for a fellowship event following worship, including a bike ride around Lake Menomin. I would like to invite council to consider helping to plan for a ministry fair and/or congregational cookout that day. Registration for Sunday School and Confirmation will take place as well.

4) Pastor Heather would like to start planning for a Christikon trip in the summer of 2023 for eight-grade confirmands. Rod motions to begin planning knowing that the church will plan to subsidize the trip for some or all of the students depending on the number that sign up. Lindsay seconds. Motion passes.

On Sunday August 7th, we celebrated our partnership with Peace and Christ Lutheran churches and our mutual support of Lutheran Campus Ministry with our annual Pack the Park worship service and lunch. The event was successful with over 200 people in attendance at worship. During worship, we also had a chance to celebrate another fun week of VBS as the VBS kids shared some special music and helped collect the offering.

With the decision to stick to one service as we move into the fall, worship and other program leaders are beginning to imagine and plan for what our Sunday mornings will look like for the fall, including some opportunities for adult education and congregation-wide events.

Rotary Feeds

We are gearing up for our next Rotary Feeds event which will take place on Rally Sunday, September 11th. We'll gather for one worship service at 9am, and then begin the packing event. We have set a tentative goal to pack 20,000 meals. We plan to have two packing shifts: 10:30am-noon and noon-1:30pm. The second shift will pack for an hour and then help with clean-up. Each shift can accommodate 50 workers. An online sign-up sheet is now active and information about the event is going out through our FB page and is on our website. An invitation has been extended to Peace and Christ Lutheran churches as well as to Lutheran Campus Ministry to join us on the day of service.

Pastoral Care

This past month, OSL led a worship service at both Neighbors of Dunn County and at the American Lutheran Home. In both of these cases, we are part of a rotating group of Menomonie area churches that provide worship opportunities for residents.

We have also been providing some ongoing and more intensive care and support for a couple of members in the congregation who are dealing with long-term health issues and concerns.

Fall Planning

Planning is underway for the upcoming program year. In addition to our Rally Sunday Rotary Feeds event we have an all-congregational Bike Around Lake Menomin Event planned for Sunday September 18th. Confirmation Orientation is scheduled for Wednesday, September 14th with the first day of class for confirmands on the following Wednesday (September 21st). The first day of Sunday School will be Sunday September 25th.

For Sunday School, we are planning to remove instruction for two and three year olds due to a shortage of teachers and difficulties in teaching children of fairly different age/development levels. We are considering adapting the north transept in the sanctuary to create a space for children to sit together and engage with the service.

Because of the pandemic we have not been able to hold a new member class for a couple of years. We have however, been taking in new members throughout this time and we are finally going to be able to formally welcome them into membership in October. We are planning on holding a new member class on October 9th after worship and then welcome new members during worship on Sunday October 23rd.

Worship

Youth and Family

VBS was this past week with a record breaking 59 kids in attendance. Luther Park had to cancel on sending counselors the Wednesday before we were to begin so it was a scramble to fill roles as teachers and music/opening leaders. Josie, Sarah, Amy (from Methodist) and myself managed to pull together enough people to lead classes and openings and closings.

We ended up giving financial compensation to helpers and adult leaders. (\$50/\$150) plus eggs and beef. We will





Namji Kim is professor of piano at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire. She graduated from the Conservatoire National Supérieur de Musique et de Danse de Paris with First Prizes in piano, chamber music, and harmony. She earned her Bachelor and Master of Music degrees from the Juilliard School, and her Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the Manhattan School of Music. She has performed in master classes given by Olivier Messiaen. A prizewinner at the International Beethoven Piano Sonata Competition and a finalist in many international piano competitions, Namji's concert schedule has included performances around North America, Europe, Ukraine, and Korea, where in addition to her recitals she appeared on television and radio broadcasts. She has appeared as a soloist with the Philharmonic Orchestra of Kharkiv at the Grand Hall of Philharmonia, Kharkiv, Ukraine under the direction of Vakhtang Jordania and the Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra at Texas Christian University under the baton of Geoffrey Simon. She has published five scholarly reviews on music, philosophy, and theology in the *Boston College Journal*, *Religion and the Arts*. Her CD recording of Gabriel Fauré's 13 Barcarolles was released by Centaur Records in 2020.
