Forward with Christ Strategic Planning Update: Reconciling in Christ Initiative

Your OSL strategic planning team, *Forward with Christ*, has been hard at work over the past year. We've learned from you and from leaders in our community about our shared needs, hopes and opportunities. We've connected with other congregations in the Chippewa Valley to learn about their ministry, too. The insights we've gleaned will now help shape our current and future plans for ministry.

One thing we've determined through this process is our mission statement (centered around 4 guiding faith practices: *Welcome, Worship, Equip, Send*) still fits! It still describes who we are and how we are called to share life and ministry together. A few months ago, the Forward with Christ Team put together 4 work groups centered on these 4 guiding faith practices and charged the groups to come up with a list of initiatives and recommendations for how we might move forward (with Christ!) in each of these areas.

In June, these work groups met to share updates of their ongoing work. We are excited to introduce 1 of the initiatives that falls under our call to *Welcome*. With council support, we are restarting our journey to become a *Reconciling in Christ* (RIC) congregation.

Reconciling in Christ is a designation given (through the organization ReconcilingWorks) to congregations who welcome and affirm all people regardless of sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression. In preparation for this formal designation, congregations are invited to engage in a variety of educational opportunities while working to compose a welcome statement that makes clear all truly means ALL. Just as ReconcilingWorks will approve our RIC designation, OSL members will also have opportunity at our next annual meeting to formally approve our RIC status.

Back in the fall of 2019, the OSL church council approved and began the work to become an RIC congregation. With the onset of the pandemic in 2020, that work was temporarily set aside. We are excited to reinvigorate this process once again!

Our first educational opportunity is a book discussion on **Sunday**, **July 30**th. We encourage you to read **One Coin Found** by **Rev. Emmy Kegler** prior to our discussion. The author is an ELCA pastor and a member of the LGBTQ+ community. Her book shares from her own experiences of being gay, Christian, and called into ordained ministry.

OSL has practiced intentional inclusion and hospitality in meaningful ways throughout our history. The RIC designation will proclaim our welcoming identity in a clear and meaningful way, that ALL may trust they are truly safe and welcome in our midst.

Thank you for your partnership in ministry. We encourage you to read the book *One Coin Found*, and if you are able, please join your pastors after worship on July 30th for some reflection and discussion!

This month I'd like to feature 3 books that were recently donated to our collection. The first 2 are the first books in the Sisters of Holmes County 3-book series by Wanda Brunstetter, who writes about the Amish and their lifestyle. Both of these are Large Print Editions. The 3rd book is an older (1946) book *David the King* by Gladys Schmitt.

<u>A Sister's Secret</u> by Wanda Brunstetter (Book One, Sisters of Holmes County Series) FIC/BRU Putting her rumschpringe (running around years) behind her, Grace Hostettler returns to Holmes County, Ohio; joins the Amish church; and begins a new life with a new romance. The next four years are nearly idyllic for the oldest Hostettler child— except for the hidden pain she bears from a carefully harbored secret.

Her peaceful world is shattered the day she runs into Gary Walker—an English man who knows enough about her past to destroy her future. Gary's arrival in Holmes County coincides with a series of startling attacks against the Hostettlers. Is Gary at the root of this evil?

Amish man, Cleon Schrock, plans to marry Grace, but is unaware of her past. When evidence of Grace's deception arrives on her family's doorstep, will Cleon abandon the woman he loves?

A Sister's Test by Wanda Brunstetter (Book Two, Sisters of Holmes County Series) FIC/BRU

Ruth is the second oldest sister in the Hostettler family and has one burning desire—to marry and fill her Amish household with children. Life seems to be falling into place when Martin Gingerich starts to court her and when she becomes a friend to a motherless child.

But her dreams are suddenly shattered in one horrific moment, putting Ruth's faith to the test. Finding herself spiritually adrift, Ruth's only real prayer becomes a desperate "Why, God?"

Esta Wengerd, one of six children, has lost her mother to tragedy and her father to depression. Can Ruth now reach past her own pain to make a difference, or will Abe Wengerd bar her interference--and stifle her healing?

Will Ruth find the faith and strength to rise above the ashes? Or will she forever question her value as a wife?

David the King by Gladys Schmitt FIC/SCH

David the King, a full-bodied retelling of the great Biblical story by the author of The Gates of Aulis, was the March, 1947, choice of The Literary Guild and the Religious Book Club. The story of David, the spoiled shepherd poet who climbed into royal favor, betrayed King Saul and his people, took over the throne, ruled Israel in her march from primitivism to the brink of decadence, and declined among the dissensions, rapes, assassinations, and revolutionary plots of his children, then sought and found his God.

Call to order at 6:02pm.

Opening Devotion

Old Business

- A. Approval of April 2023 minutes. Motion by Sarah Place, seconded by Gayle. Motion carries.
- B. Having received his resignation from the finance committee, Jeff J. motions to acknowledge and thank Arvin Solsaa for his many years of dedication and service to the finance committee and Pastor Sarah seconds. Motion carries.
- C. Financial Report: Total income \$30,156.25 and total expenses of \$29,866.13 for net gain of \$290.12. For the year, we are ahead of where we were last year. Pastor Sarah moves to approve the financial report and Sarah Place seconds. Motion carries.

D. Pastor Heather's Report

- Radio broadcast continues to function sub-optimally. We cannot determine whether the cause lies under the station's oversight or Audio Architect's (OSL).
 - Discussed plan to gather data on how many people use the radio broadcast. Will plan to continue this discussion at the next council meeting.
- Busy April in worship life and energy that continues in May with 3 baptisms and other special events during every Sunday of the month. Affirmation of Baptism was celebrated on May 7.
- Plan on introducing new liturgy in worship June 4.
- Pack the Park worship has been moved to September 17 to hopefully involve more college students.
- A generous gift of \$2000 will soon arrive as part of the technology fundraising challenge.
- Task force for visitation ministry review has met and received feedback from the Equip work group and is tentatively scheduled to meet again on May 21.

E. Pastor Sarah's Report

- We continue to have issues with the radio broadcast.
- The new refrigerator and freezer have arrived. The old, old freezer has been disposed of and the old freezer has been moved to the maintenance room and stores our Meals-to-Go.
- We've celebrated 3 baptisms this past month.
- On May 7th, we celebrated with 11 confirmands as they publicly affirmed their faith. Motion to approve Allison Bartlett, Eleanor Beck, Blake Behrens, Zachary Bird, Malia Hayden, Maxwell

- Head's up—Becky Kneer has been having struggles with her computer and has been working with 24/7 to get it resolved. There is a possibility of having a conversation about buying a new laptop for a parish nurse in the future.
- The 2023 Synod Assembly took place at Bethany Lutheran Church in Rice Lake. I want to highlight two of the resolutions below. For a full list of resolutions, click here.
 - Resolution 1: Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion
 - *The Northwest Synod of Wisconsin adopted a JDEI statement. It reads: The Northwest Synod of Wisconsin is committed to creating an environment that embodies the Commandments of Creation by furthering diversity, equity, and inclusion in the congregations and communities of the synod, as we strive to be a church practicing Divine Hospitality and a space to embody the Kingdom of Heaven on Earth.
 - * Additionally, each congregation is encouraged take a similar action to and work to create an environment that encourages awareness for others, self reflect on our own personal behaviors and biases, and make a commitment to learn about how to change them for the better.
 - Resolution 2: Land Acknowledgment.
 - * All congregations are encouraged to add a land acknowledgment to their bulletin and to and speak the words or a variation of these words: "we gather today on the ancestral land of the (appropriate tribe or nation) and honor their elders past, present, and emerging" before every public gathering, including but not limited to, worship.
 - * The assembly also approved an amendment from the floor further inviting all congregations to consider hosting a worship service during Native American Heritage Month (November) in which we honor our Native American neighbors.
