
Welcome to the Fall and a New Program Year at Our Savior's Lutheran Church!

This month I'd like to feature a book that has recently been added to our collection in memory of Lolly Baldus by the OSL Reading Club. Lolly was a treasured member of the group for a number of years, and the Reading Club chose to honor her life-long interest in politics by donating the book *The Presidents Club* by Nancy Gibbs and Michael Duffy.

Here are quotes from historians Walter Isaacson and Jon Meacham to tell you something about the book. "This is a brilliant idea for a book. At Eisenhower's inauguration, Hoover and Truman half-jokingly decided to form a 'presidents club.' 

First, thank you, Becky Kneer, for asking me to join this ministry as a partner in Parish Nursing. Becky asked me to do the visitation portion while she would do the administrative duties. It was a perfect match for me to use my education and experience in clinical/administrative nursing and religious/pastoral care. Thus, I did not have to spend time in the church building...but with the homebound members in nursing homes, assisted living facilities, clinics, hospitals, their own homes, etc.

Thank you to the Health Ministry Committee. Each member brought professional expertise and a commitment to the Health Ministry of OSL. I want to especially thank Dr. Paul Horvath for his leadership, organizational skills, conciliatory demeanor and always asking us... "what do our members want and need from us?" This committee held many educational sessions for our congregation and was blessed to have several of our own members share their expertise during these learning sessions.

Thank you to the former visitation members who blessed many of our members with their presence, listening skills, and sharing of the gospel through Scripture, prayer, and communion (Sheri, Bob, Kathy, Martha, Mary, Diane, Steve, Jan, Donna, Gloria, Gayle, Jim, Julie, and Loren). Covid and the death of several members diminished the activity of this visitation program. However, I want to thank Loren Barker, Gayle Holte, Steve and Diane Brown for continuing to be with members who love and need this ministry. You have all been the "little Christs" to them. Our homebound members need to feel like they still belong to this congregation. They love their church community. They have wonderful stories to share about their lives and spiritual journeys. I have seen the face of Jesus in each one.

Finally, thank you to the staff, members of OSL and your extended families who welcomed my ministry and care. This was a call and not a job! As Martin Luther tells us to be "little Christs" to one another, I thank you for being my "little Christs" and allowing me to see Jesus more clearly and dearly.

I wish to leave with you the same benediction I shared at the conclusion of each member's visit, always remember—"I (God) have called you by name; you are mine forever!" (Is. 43:1).

Opening Devotion

Call to order: 6:00 PM

Old Business

A. Approval of June 2023 minutes. Motion to approve June 2023 minutes made by Gayle, second made by Pastor Sarah. Motion carries.

B. Financial Report: June income was \$24,731.06, June expenses were \$26,371.56 with a net loss of \$1,640.50.

Becky presented finance concerns that were discussed with the finance committee and brought forward to council for further discussion. Revenue is less than budgeted. Expenses are well in line with budget. If trend lines continue there will be a substantial shortfall. Extensive discussion with many ideas ensued. A motion was made by Pastor Heather to approve the finance report and Gayle seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Marni made a motion to reactivate the money matters/stewardship committee to focus on giving and growing. Beth seconded the motion. Motion carried.

C. Pastor Heather's Report

Worship

After a winter and spring of very few funerals (all held at the funeral home), OSL has hosted 4 funerals in the past 2 weeks. Every funeral we host involves many volunteers who help provide hospitality and care. Many hands make for a wonderful celebration of life and faith, and provide good comfort and care for family and friends. I always feel proud and grateful for the hospitality we provide.

The new liturgy we have been learning this summer is going well. Summer attendance has been pretty consistent and every Sunday worship has felt warm and energized (from this pastor's perspective, at least!)

Call-in phone number for Worship

I have placed an order with Audio Architects to install new call-in hardware and software for worship participation. As we continue to review our Radio Broadcast (cost, use, quality of sound, dependability, etc.) we are exploring a new call-in option (which provides a call-in phone number to listen to our worship service).

OSL Choir Director

In partnership with the Personnel Committee and our Director of Music, much conversation and reflection has been shared about how to move forward with the OSL choir director role (which has been filled by our

Mission Endowment Grant approved for OSL Choir section leaders

A grant was approved for compensation for UW EC music education students for the program year (a stipend to be paid per attended rehearsal and worship service) to lead each of the 4 sections of our OSL Choir. This arrangement will provide great experience and training for these music education students, while also enriching our OSL Choir with voice and energy!

Visitation and Health Ministry Review

The task force assigned to the Visitation and Health Ministry review process will meet again on Tuesday, July 11, just prior to our council meeting. Expected agenda items include a review of time studies submitted by each of our parish nurses over the month of June (to better grasp the breadth of their ministry and weekly work schedule) as well as completion of an updated job description for our visitation and health ministry coordinator(s).

E. Pastor Sarah's Report

All Covid restrictions have finally been lifted at Neighbors of Dunn County. This has allowed us to resume our pattern of shared monthly worship there with Peace and Christ Lutheran churches.
