
BIBLE STUDY

From loss and grief to self-discovery and achievement, her faith, resilience, and honesty have allowed her to leave the old Tasha behind while she confronts the new Tasha's life from a state-of-the-art wheelchair.


Mark your calendars.....

B. Financial Report: July income was \$31,197. July expenses were \$25,586. Donor advised fund added \$6000 from the dedicated account.

C. Pastor Heather's report:

Worship:

We celebrated one baptism in the month of July and one more so far in August during worship. I have been meeting with two wedding couples who will be married in May and June of 2024. Both weddings are offsite.

Christikon:

5 high school youth traveled with me out to Christikon in Montana for 9 days in July. The trip was a great adventure and formative in faith for all. Much thanks to the Mission Endowment, the Women of OSL, our OSL youth dedicated account, and some personal donors who helped to sponsor this adventure!

Visitation Ministry:

A task force is working on a plan for how we move forward in providing meaningful care and visitation to OSL.

RIC Book Discussion:

A discussion around the book "One Coin Lost" was held on Sunday, July 30 with great attendance and conversation. More education and conversation opportunities will be scheduled in the fall (and a continued book discussion on August 13) as we move forward in our process of becoming a recognized RIC congregation.

Technology:

The cause of a failure in our video and projection on July 16 has been determined due to an update in the system. Testing the system many days of the week has been conducted to ensure (as far as I am able!) that the system is working well. We are still waiting on a replacement TV in our new conference room. The TV that was delivered to be installed by Audio Architects arrived damaged. We hope a new TV will be delivered and installed soon!

Welcome/Hospitality

Our annual Pack the Park worship service (normally held the first Sunday in August) is scheduled for Sunday, September 17th at Wakanda Park.

<u>Equip</u>

VBS took place Monday, July 31st through Thursday, Aug 3rd at Christ Lutheran Church. We had about 60 kids that participated in VBS, almost 30 youth volunteers, and an additional 15 or so adult volunteers.

As part of our Reconciling in Christ process, we held a book discussion on the book, One Coin Found by Rev. Emmy Kegler on Sunday July 30th after worship. We had a group of 15 or so that stayed for the discussion. Good conversation and interest in continuing the conversation has prompted us to offer another opportunity to gather on Sunday August 13th.




