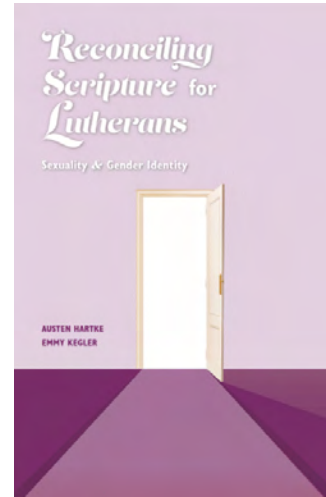

BIBLE STUDY OVERVIEW

On Sunday, October 22nd, Pr. Heather and Pr. Sarah led a Bible study based on the resource, *Reconciling Scripture for Lutherans: Sexuality and Gender Identity*.

Want to be part of the conversation? We will be scheduling a follow-up Bible study soon!



We will be ordering additional copies of the resource; they will be available in the church office.

The Bible study is part of our education process towards becoming a Reconciling in Christ (RIC) congregation and offers an opportunity to think about a number of Scripture passages that have been used to exclude members of the LGBTQ+ community.

The study began with some background information about why such conversations are important and necessary. It also provided an overview of the ways in which Lutherans read and interpret the Bible and how these interpretative lenses can help us dig more deeply and better understand the rich texts of the Bible.

Tailspin by John Armbruster – the true story of Gene Moran, a tail gunner in a B-17 Flying Fortress in WW2 who fell 4 miles trapped in the broken off tail section of his plane and survived to finally tell his story. Easy to read, down-to-earth writing, and almost unbelievable story!

The Only Woman in the Room by Marie Benedict – another winner by an author who writes about famous women. This time it is Hedy Lamar, who besides being very beautiful and a world-famous actress, was a scientist who contributed to the war effort.

Also, don’t forget the “Free Shelf”. There are some books there which are either duplicates or have been withdrawn from the OSL collection. Feel free to help yourself and add to your own personal library.

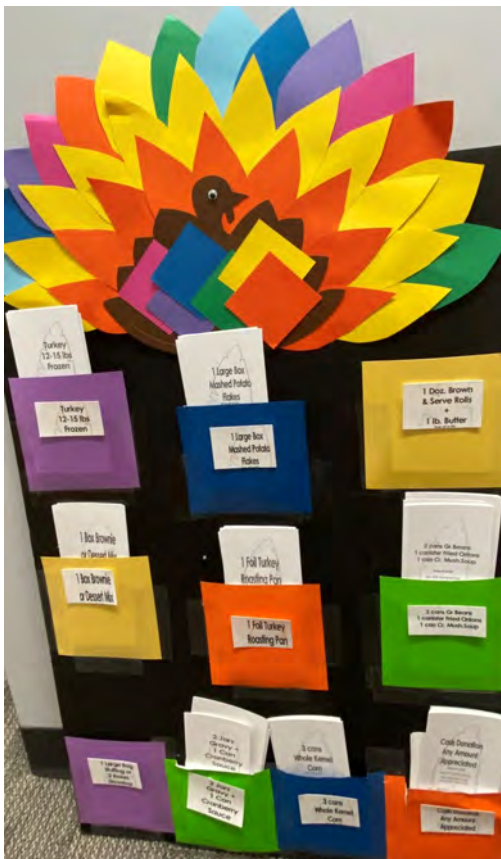

Call to order at 6:01pm.

Opening Devotion

Forward with Christ Visioning Team update from Diane Hausler.

- Let's broadcast to the congregation that we live into the worship, welcome, send, equip mission.
- Communication and updating strategies for website, social media, etc. are important things to consider as we move forward.
- Motion by Lindsay and seconded by Jeff V. to set aside a time to meet to discuss the top priorities from the Visioning team. Motion carries. Council members will have a meeting at 6pm on Thursday, September 28 to discuss what our top priorities should be.
- Motion by Lindsay, second by Jeff J. to put together a team to develop a welcoming statement. Motion carries. The team will consist of Marni, Lindsay, Pastor Sarah, and Pastor Heather.

Old Business

- A. Motion to approve August 2023 minutes by Jeff J. with a second by Sarah P. Motion carries.
- B. A partial financial statement was given for the month of August that will be revisited at the October meeting along with the September financial report.
- C. Pastor Heather's Report.
 - Great Rally Day with a picnic, bike ride, and bingo.
 - A working draft of ministry charge for our Visitation Ministry will be presented at our council meeting. The Visitation Ministry Task Force is hard at work determining our best way forward in providing meaningful care and visitation to OSL members.
 - RIC study opportunities: We have hosted two discussion and Q&A gatherings over the summer months for those interested in learning more about our RIC process and LGBTQIA+ inclusion. Our next conversation opportunity is scheduled for Sunday, October 22, following worship. We will offer a bible study around some often cited scripture passages.
 - Listen to Church is up and running. The final Radio Broadcast will be on October 1st.
 - Our replacement TV in our new conference room has finally arrived and the hybrid meeting option is

- I am still serving as a Trustee for Gustavus Adolphus College. I will be attending a board meeting this month September 21-22.
- As Pastor Sarah will be on sabbatical for the summer of 2024, it is time to begin planning for who will cover her role over the summer.
- Motion to approve planning for pastoral coverage using the funds from the Lilly grant while Pastor Sarah is on sabbatical by Jeff V. and seconded by Lindsay. Motion carries.

D. Pastor Sarah's report

- Welcome
 - In August and early September, OSL provided pastoral care and hospitality for two funeral families. Both services were held at Olson's Funeral Home.
 - Over the summer, Paul and Jean Conklin joined OSL. Motion by Pastor Sarah to approve transfer membership of Paul and Jean Conklin, second by Lindsay. Motion carries.
- Worship
 - OSL provided worship leadership for the August service at NODC.
 - On August 27th we offered a blessing and handed out backpack tags to students and teachers as they started the new school year.
- Equip
 - Confirmation begins on Wednesday, Sept 13th and Sunday School begins on Sunday Sept 24th.
- Send
 - Meet Menomonie (an annual event for new UW-Stout students) took place on Wednesday, September 6th. This year the three ELCA churches and LCM partnered together to sponsor a table.
- Sabbatical
 - In late August, I learned that I was awarded the Clergy Renewal Grant from the Lilly Foundation that I applied for. This grant will support some of my sabbatical travels next summer as well as provide funds for OSL to pay for pastoral support in my absence. The grant money will be disbursed directly to OSL and so I will work with Kim, Becky, and Pr. Heather to manage the funds as well as plan for my time away.
- Discussion about office hours. In the summer, the office hours were reduced. There has been a request from the office staff to go to 8-3 instead of 8-4. Motion to approve 8-3 non-summer hours by Jeff V. and seconded by Beth. Motion carries.

New Business

A. Committee Reports

- (a) Worship: We had a worship committee that has been dwindling for some time. We'd like to reinvigorate a worship committee. Pastors have had some conversation about how to start up that new worship committee. If you have suggestions of who should work on this committee, talk to the pastors.

- (c) Property Management: Security cameras update: wireless cameras are not an option for our building. Motion to table this discussion of security cameras by Jeff V. and seconded by Jeff J. Motion carries.
- (d) Mission Endowment: meets next week.
- (e) MOOW: Going to provide Monday night meals at campus ministry building. Council will be in charge of providing the meal on the Monday after Thanksgiving. Other work includes possibly expanding free pantry so we can offer some frozen meals, coat, hats, and mittens. Decided on a blanket drive in October. Elementary schools are always in need of snow clothing and boots to loan things out to the kids for a day so we might look into providing those types of items. Want to help Stepping Stones with their new emergency shelter and what they might need for that.

B. Other new business or discussion

- Jeff Vick wants to look into exploring with Dunn County Health to check the kitchen and building to be certified for childcare and the use of kitchen. He will report back to council with what he learns.
