Easter 2024 A Message from Bishop Laurie AN INCOMPLETE SENTENCE Mark 16:8

Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed. Alleluia!

The gospel of Mark begins with this verse, Mark 1:1, *The beginning of the good news¹ of Jesus Christ*. Then it ends with an incomplete sentence. Mark's Easter Story ends with an incomplete sentence¹. What was the editor thinking? Where are the punctuation police when you need them?

Look at it for yourself. Mark 16:8 in Greek

καὶ ἐξεληθοῦσαι ἔφυγον ἀπὸ τοῦ μνημείου, εἶχεν ὡγὰρ αὐτὰς
τρόμος καὶ ἔκστασις· καὶ οὐδενὶ οὐδὲν εἶπαν, ἐφοβοῦντο γάρ



See, it ends with the word “gar” which can be translated “for or because.” Why did the writer of Mark end the gospel with the word “because?” Word-for-word the last part of the verse reads *to none nothing they spoke they were afraid because*

So just to be clear, the purpose of the gospel of Mark is to tell the good news of Jesus Christ and then it ends with an empty tomb and the only witnesses to it run away in fear saying nothing to anyone because... It should be noted there is no punctuation in the original Greek and we can of course rearrange the English words and make a sentence, but still the incompleteness of the Greek sentence, abrupt ending and the incompleteness of story itself are telling².

Matthew, Luke and John end their Easter story with Jesus appearing to the disciples after the resurrection. These gospels end with proof of the resurrection that others see with their own eyes and some even touch Jesus. Mark has no proof of the resurrection. He doesn't even finish his last sentence.

Mark 1 was intended to be just **the beginning** of the story of the good news of Jesus. It can't be completely recorded with paper and pen because it is still being written in the lives of the believers today. Friends, the story of Easter didn't end with the frightened women. If it did we wouldn't be here today. Some of Mark's Easter story will be written by your life, my life, our witness to the empty tomb and the transforming power of God love in our life. The rest of the story will be written by those who come after us and whose lives bear witness to God's power to transform death to life. We are proof of the resurrection. Our lives transformed by the power of God's love and forgiveness are proof that Jesus rose from the dead. We are writing new verses and chapters for Mark's gospel, so that the next generation will come to know and love Jesus and all generations will experience God's grace.



Mark 16 *When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. ² And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. ³ They had been saying to one another, “Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?” ⁴ When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. ⁵ As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed. ⁶ But he said to them, “Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. ⁷ But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you.” ⁸ So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them, and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid*

This month, I’d like to feature three new novels which have recently been added to our collection. Two of them were recommended by Kathy Hirsch (the Colleen Hoover books) and the other is a book from the very popular author Barbara Kingsolver.

Demon Copperhead by Barbara Kingsolver

An Amazon Best Book of October 2022: Kingsolver takes a literary classic and makes it her own, peering into the dark corners not of Dickensian England, but of present day in the neglected hollers of Virginia’s Appalachian Mountains. Damon Fields, nicknamed Demon Copperhead, came into the world already behind the eight ball of life, and before long he’s in foster care placements that resemble work camps more than loving homes. Throughout this coming-of-age novel, the rug is constantly pulled out from under him but Demon has reserves of Olympian endurance that somehow, like the man in the arena, enables him to get back up again and again. His knees get dusty—he faces hunger, cruelty, loss, and is swept up in the tidal wave of OxyContin that overtakes his tiny county—but he never loses his love for the place that claims him as its own. Kingsolver’s writing is arresting and illuminating; in baring Demon’s soul on the page she gives voice and visibility to a place and its people where beauty and desperation live side by side. —*Seira Wilson, Amazon Editor*

- B. Financial Report: Total income of \$44,479.65 and expenses of \$26,133.70 for a net income of \$18,345.95. Jeff motions to approve financial report and Beth seconds. Motion carries.
- C. Pastor Heather's Report
 - Worship
 - Advent and Christmas: We celebrated a wonderful Advent and Christmas season at OSL. Christmas Eve shared the same date as the 4th Sunday of Advent, which made planning Christmas Eve worship times a bit tricky, but our schedule seemed to worked well enough. Our 9am (4th Sunday of Advent) service welcomed 85 worshippers, our 4pm Christmas Eve service welcomed 262 worshippers, and our 7pm Christmas Eve service welcome 86 worshippers. Next year Christmas Eve will fall on a Tuesday, which will be easier to plan!
 - Lent: Lent is early this year, with Ash Wednesday falling on February 14. I would like to discuss lenten supper plans with council.
 - RIC
 - Three different bulletin informational inserts will be shared on Sundays in January. A welcome statement has been written and is ready for approval by the council. The statement will be included in the bulletin insert on Sunday, January 21, and the congregation will be given opportunity for discussion and questions following worship that morning.
 - Our recommended welcome statement is as follows:

Our Savior's Lutheran Church believes that all people are beloved of God. We celebrate and give thanks for the sacredness of all people. We affirm and embrace people of all ages, races, backgrounds, cultures, sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions. Rooted in Jesus' call to love and serve our neighbor, we are committed to the work of anti-racism and the work of social, economic, and environmental justice in our community and in the world. We believe that by being inclusive of all people we better embody Christ's teaching to love one another. We welcome you on this journey with us to live in faith active in love.
 - Sanctuary bat sighting: A bat was sighted during our 7pm Christmas Eve service by some worshippers. I have alerted our custodian and property committee.
 - Budget Planning Meeting: A reminder that the council and finance committee will be meeting Sunday, January 14, following Sunday School at 11am. We need to make plans for food if lunch is to be included.

- Possible Senior High Christikon Trip: A number of students have approached me with a request to travel to Christikon again this summer. I am working on a possible trip, if all the details align with my schedule and the church calendar.
- We will be electing a bishop in our synod this year. Lay members of the congregation can attend the caucus meeting to learn more about this process on February 8 at 7pm via zoom. If council members are available to attend, let Pastor Heather know.
- Dan Kruger might be looking for ways to get more connected again. He might be willing to serve on council.
- Lent is coming up and starts on February 14 for Ash Wednesday. We hope to use the same plan as last year with the Lenten soup suppers. Theme for Lent is around generosity.

D. Pastor Sarah's Report.

- Welcome/Hospitality
 - It is our hope to begin our visitation ministry in January. We have a small group of visitors who are being paired with some of our homebound members. The goal is to visit folks on a monthly basis. We have used some memorial money to purchase prayer books and new communion kits for our visitors to use.
- Worship
 - December was filled with lots of lovely opportunities for worship, including candlelight Christmas Eve services. Both Christmas Eve services were filled with joy, beautiful music, and holy moments. On December 17th our Sunday School students presented A Very Mixed-Up Christmas Pageant. Students from our Sunday School program and several of our confirmands were part of the service.
- Equip
 - Our Youth Gathering Students are continuing to sell Kwik Trip gift cards as a fundraiser for their trip. Other fundraising opportunities are currently being planned by students/families.
 - Family Fun Day is planned for January 7th. Due to the lack of snow, we will be going roller skating.
